FINAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS Division of the History of Chemistry

Reference is made to the December 13, 2010 e-mail from Dr. Vera V. Mainz, Secretary-Treasurer of the Division of the History of Chemistry (HIST), to Barbara Polansky, Staff Liaison to the Committee on Constitution and Bylaws (C&B), submitting the vote certification on the revised bylaw amendments and confirming that all bylaw requirements for voting on the proposed amendments were followed and approved by the membership. Reference is also made to C&B's Preliminary Report dated February 9, 2010, and to the Division's bylaws dated October 5, 1995, which are no longer valid.

C&B has examined all proposed amendments as requested and amended. All the required and most of the recommended changes proposed by C&B were made by the Division. C&B made formatting changes and additional minor edits for consistency and clarity.

The Division's bylaws are now legal and consistent with the SOCIETY's documents, and internally consistent with its own bylaws.

Regarding future bylaw amendments, C&B is available to review bylaw proposals before they are voted on so that returning to the electorate is avoided in those cases where the changes that are sought cannot be approved.
